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Dear Parents and carers,

We would like to update you on our provision for Remote Learning in the current times, starting from next week.

In the time that your child is off from school, we would like to extend the concept of learning beyond the classroom. We understand if your child is sick they may be unable to complete any of the suggested activities, however, if they are well enough, we would like you to encourage them to engage in learning at home.

A reminder that remote learning for our younger children in Reception and Nursery can be found on the Early Years page on the school website.

Remote Learning for KS1 will be set through the same platforms currently being used. Purple Mash for Year 1 and Google Classroom for Year 2. Should they wish, they can complete some of the suggested writing activities below in addition.

Remote learning for KS2 has been revised and is set out below.

Please support your child to work independently if they can.

If you need ANY resources such as books to read, pens, paper etc, please contact us and we will have these ready for you to pick up.

We suggest:

Daily See below	One activity whilst in isolation for the subjects below, either from the suggested 'useful websites' in google classroom or the Purple Mash 'To Dos'. If you would like to, you can do more.

Below are suggested activities for all year groups and can be completed at any level. Your child's work will be looked, but not deeply marked.

English – Activities to do at home

- Looking out the window – Cloud gaze. Look out of your window at all the different cloud pictures and shapes. This is a very calming activity perfect to try when you are at home when you should be at school.
- Draw the cloud and write inside the cloud how it makes you feel.
- Sit by your window and watch for any activity going on outside your window. This could be:

For example:

If you are on a busy road you might see different vehicles or children coming from or going to school

You might see a flying bird.

Make a record of what you see in any way you wish. You may want to draw a picture, a grid where you can show how many cars or birds or scooters you have seen, and so on. You may also want to write a story based on the activities you can see from your window.

Free writing ideas / titles:

- Write about yourself
- Write about a dream
- Re-write one of your favourite stories including yourself as a character. For example, you could be one of the children in 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'.
- If you are older, you could pick your favourite core text read in school, re-write the story with you as one of the main characters.
- Write about your future plans, starting with 'Five years from now, I will be.....'
- If you could travel back in time, where would you go? Think about your learning in History, Geography, Spanish and other subjects, where you have learnt about different places in the world.
- You wake up today with the super power of your choosing, what would be your mission of the day and how would you accomplish it.
- Out of the ashes arose a hero / heroine. Draw a picture of the hero/heroine and label their clothes and accessories, explain what their super power is, and describe them. You could write paragraphs, a story or poem.
- The door you had locked is wide open. Finish off this story.
- How would you imagine Bounds Green School to look in 50 years' time? Draw this world and describe it. You might include what cars, buildings and houses looked like.

Reading

- Choose a book from home and read at least 20 minutes a day.
- Write a review of the book, or describe one of the characters or scenes.
- What is your opinion of the book, giving detailed reasons?
- Word to describe the book.
- Create a ratings grid, give the book a rating and explain why you would recommend it or not.
- Find the longest word in the book, then explain the meaning and see how many new words you can make from this word.
- Create a new front cover for this book, or any book of your choice
