
### Sports Day – Years 1-6 – Volunteers and Lunch Information

A reminder that the Sports Day for all children in Years 1-6 will take place on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> June. Years 1-3 will be going in the morning, and then Years 4-6 will be going in the afternoon.

The children will require a packed lunch on the day. These will automatically be provided by the school for all children who receive benefit-related Free School Meals, but if your child isn't eligible for benefit-related FSM and you would like your child to have a packed lunch made by the school, please call the office by Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> June to request one. If we don't receive a phone call and your child is <u>not</u> <u>eligible</u> for FSM due to family income, then we will presume that your child will bring a packed lunch from home.

#### Nut-Free School

Please remember that we are a nut-free school, this includes After School Club. Please don't pack an After School Club snack for your child that includes nuts, such as; peanut butter sandwiches, granola bars (as many also contain nuts), etc.

#### **School Payments**

As an on-going reminder we'd like to make sure parents and carers keep up to date with their school payments. You can make payment via School Gateway using your mobile and email address. If you are having any troubles with creating an account or logging in, please make sure that the office has the most up-to-date information for you.

# Reporting Absences and Late Collections

If you need to report your child absent for any reason (sickness, appointment, etc) then please make sure you do this through the voicemail service on the phone, or through a text on School Gateway. Please <u>don't</u> email the admin email address as this is not continually monitored, especially during busy periods so may not be seen until later in the day.

#### Change of Year 2 performance date

The Year 2 performance was originally scheduled for the 18<sup>th</sup> July but Louise (dance teacher) is unfortunately unavailable. The new date for the performance is now **Friday 19<sup>th</sup> July**, this is the same date as our scheduled trip to Alexandra Palace which we will still do but after the performance.

#### First Aid Communication

If a child has been hurt at school we have an online medical tracking system where we record all the injuries. As per our policy, if a child has bumped their head and there is a risk of concussion then we will email the parent letting them know of the incident. If the child is in Nursery through to Year 2 then this email will also be accompanied by a phone call.

#### Sports Days – Early Years

Please note that the Early Years (Nursery and Reception) Sports Day will be held on a different day to the rest of the school. The Nursery sports day will take place on 10<sup>th</sup> July in the morning, and the Reception sports day will take place on the 11<sup>th</sup> July, both between 9:30-10:30am.

#### **Boys and Girls Athletics Tournament**

It was a fantastic sporting week for many of our pupils at Bounds Green, with both the Boys' and Girls' teams bringing home bronze medals at Haringey's Year 5/6 Tournament. We are extremely proud of all children who worked so hard to achieve this as a team, as all of their scores combined to place them up on the podium. As a team, we managed to finish in the top 3 in 11 out of the 16 races we participated in, with the highlight of the day being the Girls team winning their relay!



#### **Cricket and Tennis Tournaments**

Last week, Bounds Green have been involved in Girls' Cricket, Boys' Cricket and Tennis tournaments. Unfortunately, no silverware was brought home with our highest finishing position being joint fourth in the Year 5/6 Boys Cricket event, within which we had the highlight of the week, with Bounds Green trailing by 5 points on the final ball, winning the game through Seb (Yr5) hitting a 6 and winning the game! We are so proud of all of our children who have represented the school this week, and those who will represent in the coming weeks!
