Welcome back to the new half term at Bounds Green!

It has been a pleasure to see Year 6 return from their adventures at Pendarren in South Wales. The children enjoyed canoeing, a river walk, caving, bouldering and walks in the beautiful Welsh countryside. The children strengthened their relationships with each other, and with the adults from school. The children made memories which will last forever! They enjoyed staying over with their friends and the food at the Pendarren Centre, which is owned and run by Haringey Council. We have an exciting half term to come, which is full of learning!

We will be explaining our Bounds Green Schoolvalues (challenge, value, nurture) to the children in assemblies this half term and in PHSE lessons we will be seeking the children's views about what we are doing well and what we can do even better. We will be gathering views from parents and carers at Parents Evenings in the week beginning 18th November, so please come



ready with your views about our values, what we do well, and where we can improve. We are using stakeholder views to inform our School Development Plan, so what you tell us will shape the future of Bounds Green School.

We have many performances planned for the end of term, including Year 4 whole class instrumental performances on guitar, violin, trumpet or clarinet performances by all classes, choir performances at Alexandra Palace, Y3 and Y5 singing as year groups following their assemblies with our specialist singing teacher, and Early Years songs and mime of the Christmas Story. Please see the diary dates at the end of this newsletter so you do not miss your child! Year 5 children will be performing a dance linked to their learning in class next Tuesday morning which they have developed with Louise, our specialist dance teacher.

We have several sporting competitions planned for our children.

Today a mixed team of Year 5 and 6 children went to a rugby tournament at Riverside. Later in the term, we will have a mixed Year 3 and 4 football tournament,

#### **Nut-Free School**

Please remember that we are a nut-free school, this includes After School Club. Please don't pack an After School Club snack for your child that includes nuts, such as; peanut butter sandwiches, granola bars (as many also contain nuts), etc.

#### **School Payments**

As an on-going reminder we'd like to make sure parents and carers keep up to date with their school payments. You can make payment via School Gateway using your mobile and email address. If you are having any troubles with creating an account or logging in, please make sure that the office has the most up-to-date information for you.

# Reporting Absences and Late Collections

If you need to report your child absent for any reason (sickness, appointment, etc) then please make sure you do this through the voicemail service on the phone, or through a text on School Gateway. Please don't email the admin email address as this is not continually monitored, especially during busy periods so may not be seen until later in the day.

For any late collections or if someone different is collecting, please also call directly to the office with as much notice as possible so that it can be passed onto the teacher

Later this half term, Year 1 will have a special visitor, as Florence Nightingale will come to Bounds Green School to bring the children's History learning to life! The Year 1 children will meet her and be able to ask her questions. Year 1 will also catch the bus to visit The Arts Depot in North Finchley to watch their performance of 'The Gruffalo's Child'. Reception children will take the tube to Hammersmith to watch the pantomime of 'Father Christmas'. We are seeking parent and carer helpers from Reception and Year 1 classes to make these very safe and well-supervised trips - please speak to your class teacher.

We have seen much enthusiasm from the children and they have been very keen to write. Teachers have been enjoying the new texts as well! Note: please do not read these books ahead of children's learning in class as this will spoil the surprise for them...

This year we have introduced using a new approach to teaching writing called The Power of Reading. It has been developed by a charity called The Centre for Literacy in Primary Education. Each half term, classes will base their learning around a high quality children's book which is a model of effective language. Children will enjoy the text, analyse the language used and magpie high quality vocabulary. Then children will explore the themes and story in the book through drama, group discussion and shorter pieces of writing. Finally, the children will write, edit and publish a longer piece of writing based on this text. Teachers have had training on this approach and many year groups planned using this approach last half term. To the right are some of the texts that we have been reading... 


#### Yr6 Pendarren Trip – October 2024


This year, for the first time since becoming a three-form school, Bounds Green went to Pendarren as a whole year group! 74 children and 8 staff spent the week before half term in the Brecon Beacons pushing themselves to their limits. The children undertook a wonderful range of activities including climbing, a pitch-black tunnel adventure, zip wire, caving, walking up mountains and through waterfalls, as well as following the journey of a river through the beautiful Welsh countryside from its source. The activities are designed to broaden their horizons, overcome their fears and build their team spirit and self-esteem. Most importantly the children developed their independence and sense of self, which should stand them in good stead for the rest of year 6 and the challenges of secondary beyond. The experienced staff in Pendarren were wonderful as always and put on evening activities including a spell-binding story teller - Daniel Moden, a night walk and scary stories around a fire in the teepee. #### **Change to Collection Arrangements**
