Moving from Year 2 to Year 3

Attendance and Punctuality

Year Group	Start of the school day	End of the school day
Year 3	8.50am	3.25pm

- ❖ Soft start- no parents/ carers allowed inside the building
- ❖ If a different adult is collecting your child, please let us know **via the school office**

Lateness

- ❖ Children must be in class by 9.05am
- ❖ After the doors close at 9.05am children must go via the school office so they can pick up a late card to give to their teacher

End of Day: Changes in pick-ups must be provided in writing via the office, **not the class email (if on the day).**



Moving from Year 2 to Year 3

The school week

- ❖ English, Maths, Reading every day.
- ❖ Science, History, Geography, RE, PSHE, Music, Computing, PE, Spanish, Art each week.
- ❖ Library once per week
- ❖ 5 lessons of Dance (currently this half-term).
- ❖ **Dance performance - Tuesday 20th October - 9.15am**

Assemblies

- ❖ **Monday** - Phase Assembly - usually linked to our school PSHE theme. Led by Damien, Helen or phase leaders
- ❖ **Friday** - Celebration Assembly - Star of the Week, Attendance & Punctuality celebrations
- ❖ **Alternate Wednesdays** - Singing Assembly led by Andrew.

School council

- ❖ 2 children elected each term and a half. They meet with Helen each half term
- ❖ Mini meetings in class for councilors to feedback and take any ideas from others.

Reading for pleasure

WE LOVE BOOKS!

- ❖ Through our topic books and story times we encourage and nurture a love of reading.
- ❖ Please support us in doing this by encouraging your child to read at home and share books and stories together as much as possible.
- ❖ Children can borrow books from their classroom book corner and from the school library.

Bags must be used to take books home and it is essential that they are returned so that they can be enjoyed by other children.



Home Learning

Please help to support your child's learning by:

- ❖ Listening to your child read for at least 20 minutes per day
- ❖ Practising their spellings regularly at home (usually a Friday)
- ❖ Practising number bonds and times-tables for a minimum of 5 minutes each day
- ❖ Engaging in topic related tasks that are set each term on Purple Mash from end of October onwards
- ❖ Encouraging use of the Times Tables Rockstars to improve times tables fluency and quick recall



Housekeeping

What to bring to school

Each day:

- ❖ a book bag/back pack
- ❖ a named, reusable water bottle
- ❖ A fruit snack (optional)
- ❖ Snacks for clubs (no nuts)



Each Monday/Tuesday/Wednesday/Thursday:

- ❖ Suitable clothes and footwear for PE and SSS
- ❖ an old oversized t-shirt to protect clothing in art lessons (this can be kept in school)

A polite reminder that:

- ❖ no toys or other belongings from home should be brought into school
- ❖ No jewellery should be worn to school with the exception of small studded earrings

Housekeeping

- ❖ If we are unable to speak with you at the end of the day then we will contact you by email or phone at an appropriate time.
- ❖ Please make sure that the office has your up to date contact details including telephone numbers and email addresses. It is very important that we can contact you quickly during the school day.
- ❖ For medical or attendance needs please contact the office. All medicine must go via the office.
- ❖ You can contact us by calling/emailing the office or emailing us directly on our class email.

Communication

- ▶ We encourage ongoing dialogue with parents regarding your little ones, however please note **the most appropriate time to catch us is at the end of the day** when we can schedule in a meeting.
- ▶ A gentle reminder that parents should not be entering the school building in the morning.
- ▶ You are welcome to send us an email via our school email address (find on the sheet provided) but **please note we often don't get a chance to check these during the school day.**
- ▶ Please allow up to 3 days for an email response.
